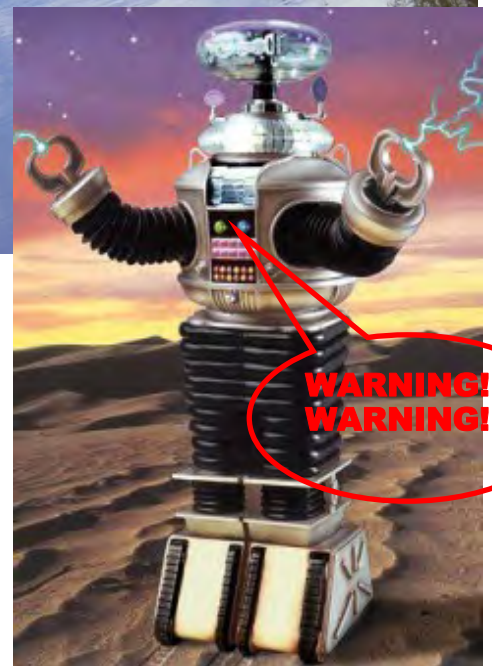

### Rural in Reach Services Update

Since 2012, the Womens Health and Family Services (WHFS) Rural in Reach program has been committed to working with communities to value-add to resources on the ground and provide a bridge to health and well-being services. These services have included counselling and community training and workshops on various health and well-being topics via video conference, phone and Westlink broadcasts. During this time, we developed strong relationships with Community Resource Centres and other regional service providers that were a vital link to creating a relevant and needs-based service.

Over the last two years there has been a vast reduction in service provision from Rural in Reach due to limited funding. While continuing to support regional WA in what capacity we could, we were working hard to find financial partners to aid in service sustainability. From October 2016-June 2017, we collaborated with 360 Health and Community to provide remote counselling to Mid-West and Goldfields/Esperance communities. Although unable to offer the same services State-wide during this time, Rural in Reach did provide over 100 counselling sessions responding to general mental health concerns and situational stressors such as relationship challenges, moving house and parenting through to depression, anxiety, grief and loss, suicidal ideation and traumatic experiences. Overall

feedback from clients was that they felt more resources to cope with life's challenges after support and either required no more ongoing support or were linked in with local services.

Moving forward, as of July 2017, WHFS and Rural in Reach will recommence offering a State-wide health and well-being service to regional WA. By this smiley face you can see how pleased we are to share this with you!

Rural in Reach will continue to provide free health and well-being counselling by video conference, phone and even email. With many areas that we can support such as parenting, grief and loss, trauma alcohol and other drug misuse as well as general mental and physical health.

As we are just getting back 'on our feet', we won't be offering any 'Community Talks' just yet but we will be able to offer remote training in mental health responses for non-health professionals with the *Community Mental Health 1st Responses Training Package* and professional training in *Trauma Informed Practice*. Plus Supervision and Debriefing services.

## District Health Advisory Councils: Your voice in country health services

Listening to and learning from the perspectives of consumers, carers, and communities is essential to improving health care and meeting the health service needs of all country Western Australians.

That is why the WA Country Health Service (WACHS) has a network of well-established, passionate, and active District Health Advisory Councils (DHACs) which provide the consumer voice to local, regional, and state-wide health service planning and improvement.

The DHACs are groups of committed volunteers, comprised of health consumers, community members, and carers. They act as key advisors and partners, informing local health service leadership on the health and service issues that are most important to the communities they represent.

If you have a suggestion about how your health service can make improvements or have any concerns about services in your community, have a chat to the DHAC Chairperson or members in your area. They are there to advocate on your behalf. You can also give feedback to WACHS outlining what was good, what could be improved, say thanks, or call for change by visiting [www.patientopinion.com.au](http://www.patientopinion.com.au). It's anonymous and you can see how your feedback is used to make country health services better for everyone.

DHACs are often looking for new members, keen to ensure that as many groups and individuals within communities can be included in conversations about health.

DHAC members work in partnership with the local health service and take an active role in:

- Promoting the consumer experience and voice in country health services;
- Providing advice and advocacy to WACHS at local, regional and state levels on health issues that are important to consumers in DHAC districts;
- Building connections between DHACs, consumers, WACHS and other community and health groups.
- Providing suggestions for, and participating in activities aimed at improving the health of the community with a focus on service safety, quality, access, and health literacy.
