From the CRC,

As we all are aware Cue has had some hot weather for the past few months and doesn't show signs of cooling down anytime soon. Unfortunately Cue isn't the only place around Australia to be receiving bad weather. Over the last couple of months Townsville in Queensland has had constant flooding, damaging houses and land. WA had a 4.5 magnitude earthquake 66km North West of Carnarvon in early February. Coming up to the 10th anniversary of "Black Saturday" that led to a death toll of 131 lives, Victoria is now preparing to evacuate people due to another large fire spreading throughout towns. Meanwhile, Sydney as well as Cue is reaching temperatures averaging in the high 40s with some locations reaching a scorching 50 degrees. Even though Chicago is not located in Australia it also has had decreasing temperature of as low as -46C, with a death toll of 12 and climbing.

We ask that during this time and heat, people do not leave their children or pets unattended in cars. It's a life threatening issue that causes severe damage to the body and possibly could cause death. If you are taking your pets out for a walk please make sure the ground is not too hot for their feet by placing the back of your hand on the ground, if it's too hot for your hand it's defiantly too hot for your pets.

On a brighter note it's Valentines day this month and love is in the air! If you have someone in your life that you'd like to show love towards, do it! Don't wait until tomorrow, next week or even next month. A simple gesture can go far. It doesn't have to be something big or expensive, even a simple act of kindness like telling someone they look great or that they mean a lot to you is showing a loving effort. These acts of love and kindness could help improve someone's day, not only to your significant others but also your friends and family. So remember to be kind to one another and share the love.

FROM THE DESK OF THE CEO

Anybody that didn't make it to the Shire's Australia Day celebrations missed out on a fantastic breakfast. Shire admin staff did a great job of dressing up the hall and preparing the food, while Councillor Les Price manned the barbecue. After breakfast, Shire President Ross Pigdon presented the Citizen of the Year Award to Helene Salame who had made a special trip back to Cue with her family for the event. A group of enthusiastic learners then tried their hand at lawn bowls in preparation for the upcoming barefoot bowls competition.



With the financial year already more than half over, planning for town improvements contained in the budget is intensifying. Keep an eye out for the following works:

- The ablution block at the cemetery is almost complete and materials have been ordered to construct a niche wall for the interment of ashes.
- An order has been finalised for bin surrounds for street bins in Austin Street that feature historical photos of Cue and surrounding towns.
- A collection of outdoor exercise equipment targeting most muscle groups is to be installed, with an area close to the oval currently the likely location.
- Mobile skate ramps for use by skateboards and scooters are proposed to be installed in the currently unused cricket pitch area next to the basketball courts to determine whether there is enough interest to warrant construction of a larger skate park.
- Construction of two new houses to be leased to the State Government for police accommodation .
- Redevelopment of the old railway station building into an after school youth drop-in centre.

FROM THE DESK OF THE CEO

The Shire recently took delivery of a new 24 tonne Multipac multi tyre roller to replace the 14 tonne Bomag roller which had been scheduled for disposal in Council's plant replacement program. The heavier machine will provide greater compaction, assisting the Shire to better prepare roads for the heavy transport operations associated with increased mining activity. A new 20 tonne vibrating drum roller is expected to be delivered in the next few weeks.

Free mammograms for CUE women

If you are a woman aged 40 or over you can access the FREE screening mammography service in Cue. BreastScreen WA's mobile service will be located at Cue Health Centre car park, 310 Victoria Street from 27/02/2019 to 28/02/2019.

Breast cancer is the most common life threatening cancer for women and one in eight women in Australia will develop breast cancer in their lifetime.

Having a screening mammogram (breast x-ray) every two years significantly increases the chance of a woman surviving breast cancer and reduces the amount of treatment required. More than 75% of breast cancers occur in women over the age of 50. Research shows that screening is most effective for this age group.

BreastScreen WA's Medical Director Dr Elizabeth Wylie, said screening mammography was the most effective method for early detection of breast cancer.

"Screening every two years is vitally important to increase the chance of a breast cancer being detected when it is too small to feel or be noticed. Finding a cancer at this early stage often means that the breast cancer is small and more treatable".

"A free screening mammogram is one of the best things that women can do to look after their health. Breast screening saves lives and only takes 20 minutes," said Dr Wylie.

Screening mammograms may detect 70-90% of breast cancers.

Any woman with a persistent change in a breast should see her doctor immediately.

The mobile service will then be moving to Meekatharra and Newman.

BreastScreen WA encourages women to make an informed decision about having a mammogram. For more information please visit the BreastScreen WA website www.breastscreen.health.wa.gov.au
