Work is well advanced on resurfacing of the basketball and tennis courts. Unfortunately, there will be a short period after the refurbishment is complete when the courts will be unavailable while the surface cures.


Murdoch University ran another successful Vet Program in Cue on Sunday 20 October, with approximately a dozen animals treated. Students from the university provided free pet checks and sterilisation under the guidance of a senior vet, with microchipping and vaccinations also available. The annual program is funded by the Shire as a service to registered cat and dog owners.

Thank you to all those ratepayers who paid their rates by the due date. The rates incentive prize draw will be conducted at the November Council meeting, with eligible entries going into the draw for the opportunity to receive a \$600 first prize, with \$300 for second and \$100 for third.

The next meeting of Cue Parliament will be held on Friday 22 November. State Government representatives and members of parliament are expected to attend.

Member for Mining and Pastoral**



At the age of sixteen Robin Scott came from Scotland with his parents to Western Australia, where he enrolled as an apprentice electrician. Immensely proud of his trade, Robin has worked for more than 30 years as an electrical contractor to the WA mining industry, especially the Goldfields. Flying himself and his staff to electrical contracting assignments, Robin logged 4,000 hours in his Rockwell Commander, the aircraft he now uses to service his constituents in the vast Mining and Pastoral Region.

Robin is an enthusiastic campaigner for job opportunities through creating more apprenticeships for young men and young women. The Federal Government has partially embraced the Pauline Hanson's One Nation Policy of subsidising apprentice wages 75% in the first year, 50% in the second and 25% in the third year.

Robin Scott moved the Disallowance Motion which defeated the Government's attempt to increase the Gold Royalty by 50%. Robin is determined to protect and promote mining and led the defence against water charges for prospectors and small miners.

Robin's priorities for 2019 include:

- Water pipeline south from the Kimberley
- Supply good clean water for all regional people
- Reopen the Department of Mines Industry Regulation Safety Office in Norseman
- Sealing the Wiluna-Meekatharra Road
- Insist on rapid delivery of the promised MRI machine for Kalgoorlie
- Big upgrade for palliative care in the regions
- Aged care facility for Leonora
- New hospital for Laverton
- New hospital for Meekatharra
- Ensure the Nursing posts are manned by more than one nurse and are secure and safe for staff
- Abolish fringe benefit tax to encourage FIFO workers to live locally
- Speed up dog fencing and increase the number of professional doggers
- More jobs through quicker approvals for mines

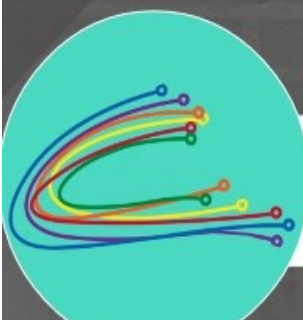

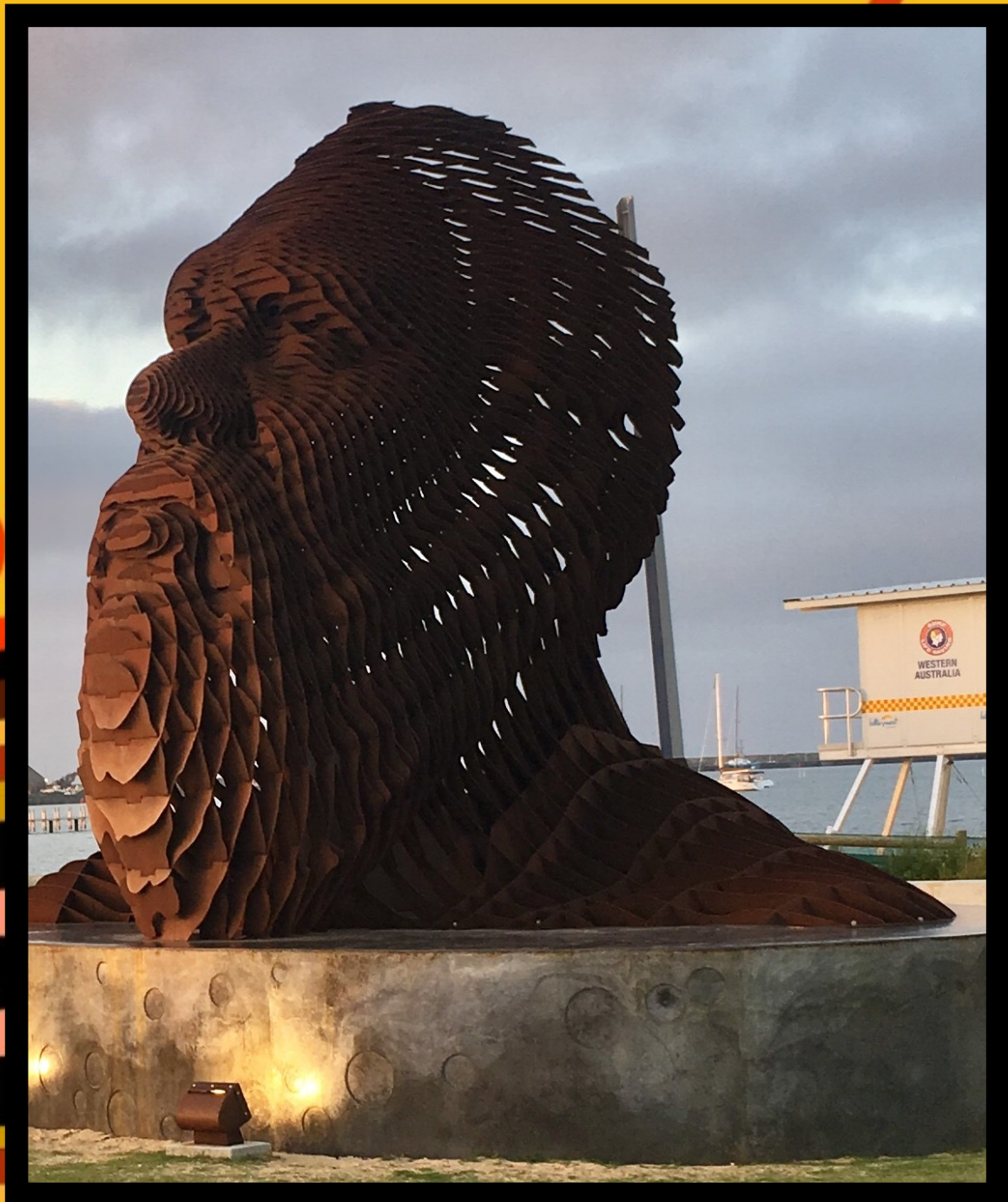

DELICIOUS HOME MADE PARTY PIES.

Read hint selection and method before you begin.

- 1 cup of diced bacon
- 500g of minced
- Puff Pastry sheets
- Egg Wash
- teaspoons of garlic
- Reasonable amount of onion
- A pinch of oregano
- A pinch of salt and pepper
- 1/4 cup of milk
- 1 room temperature egg
- 2 cups of gravy

Get your puff pastry out and let it defrost, if you try to push the pastry into the mould too soon it will crack. Try not to leave your pastry out too long or the butter in the pastry will melt. Pour all your mince into a hot pan and start browning it, adding the garlic, onion, oregano, salt and pepper. Now you can make your gravy. Add your gravy to your mince and let it cool, minimum 2 hours. Get some cupcake tins out be sure to grease really well with butter or cooking spray.

After the pastry has thawed get the large and small drinking glasses and use to cut out the bottom and top of your pies. Grab a steak knife and a large cup, use the top of your cup and push down onto the pastry and trace around it with the knife, do as many of those as you can, repeated with your smaller glass.



Gently put the bottom of the pastry in, It doesn't have to touch the bottom of the tray, it just has to be close, and DO NOT push down the edges or you will not be able to get them out when you want to eat them....Yummy, Anyway, as I was saying, now you can make your egg wash. Put the egg in a bowl and beat well, add the milk and beat it again. Wash the edge of the pastry moulds with the egg wash. Now you can get the mince and put not quite a quarter of a cup in each mould. Place the smaller size pastry over the top, press the edge very lightly with a fork. Now its time to decorate the pies with the left over pieces of the pastry until thin, not too thin or your pastry will break. Now get a knife and cut out the pieces of pastry into a shape of a leaf. Wash the top of the pie with the egg mixture. Now you can put the leaf shaped pieces of pastry on your pies and then put them in the fridge, try to do all this as fast as you can so your pastry doesn't get all sticky. Now put in the fridge for an hour minimum, when you are ready to cook leave the party pies in for 30 minutes then check them. If still not cooked put in oven for another 10 minutes.

HINT SECTION:

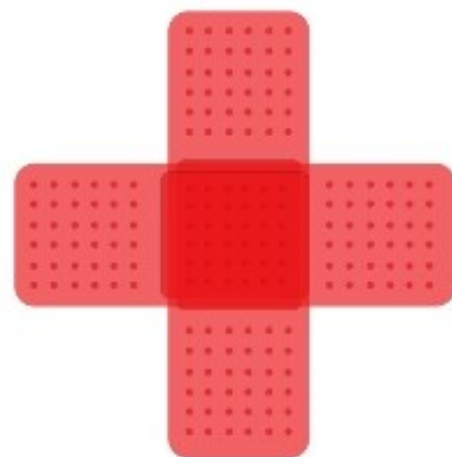
1. You can tell when your pies are ready when the top of your pies are browned.
2. Get your pastry out first.
3. They go best with mash potato and steamed veg.
